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

Dear Attorney General,

On the 3rd June 2019 a Notice of Seizure of Collateral/Crystallization of Charges/Deed of Appointment of Managing Controller dated 1st June 2019 ("**the Notice**") was served on the Crown Solicitor for the State of Tasmania and the Attorney General of the Commonwealth of Australia (Managing Controller Appointed) as the first officer of law in the jurisdiction for **Her Royal Highness Queen Elizabeth II (Managing Controller Appointed)**.

Receipt of Service has been acknowledged for Regina (Managing Controller Appointed) by the Commonwealth Director of Public Prosecutions (Managing Controller Appointed) who is prosecuting two Criminal Proceedings brought in the name of Regina (Managing Controller Appointed) pursuant to s61 of *the Commonwealth of Australia Constitution Act 1900* (Uk) which proceedings are relevantly referred to on the face of my letter dated 16th June 2019 addressed to the Reserve Bank of Australia (Managing Controller Appointed) (**Annexure 1**)

Please accept the service of Annexure 1 upon You as service of the Notice (without annexures); a full copy of the Notice with annexures will be attached to following emails forwarding service on the Crown Solicitor of Tasmania on the 3rd June 2019 being service of the whole of the Notice.

Please also note **Annexure 2** as an index to that letter.



Significant issues related to breaches of treaties by the Commonwealth of Australia, and unfortunately by Her Majesty pursuant to s61 and the principles of civil and criminal vicarious liability, including, Australian Treaty Series No 5, 23 & 39, the Charter of the Commonwealth of Nations as revised on the 11th March 2013 and the Charter of the United Nations in recent Royal Commissions and other investigations into;

1. The Stolen Generation
2. Institutional Responses into complaints of Child Sex Abuse
3. The Financial System
4. Franchising
5. Aged Care
6. Victoria Police

Relevantly the various Royal Commissioners did not complete their roles under the Letters Patent to make findings in respect to collapse of Rule of Law, Good Governance, Freedom of Expression, Separation of Powers, the Right to a Fair Hearing, the Right to Remedy, Reputation, Right Privacy, Dealing with one's own wealth, Protection of Property, and Intellectual Property amongst other things.

The Notice sets out a number of issues a principle issue being the abdication of the Role of Champion of the Public Interest by Her Majesty's Attorney Generals.

I have previously offered to settle this 25 year dispute on more than one occasion which fell on deaf ears of Regina's agents, employees, servants, officers, contractors, delegates, contractors, licensees and otherwise (hereinafter "**Regina (Managing Controller Appointed)**") consequently there have been a number of matters arising that I have sought to ventilate through filing and serving of Notices of Constitutional Matters in a number of proceedings as summarized in my Notice of Constitutional Matters dated 21st October 2018 and otherwise referred to in the Notice, however Regina (Managing Controller Appointed) is protected by a corrupt judiciary through breaches of Separation of Powers and application of the Bethcar Strategy.

I am certain that none of this detail comes as any surprise to Her Majesty or you however, it appears that the efforts of the Commonwealth Secretariat in 2013, subsequently and prior have failed to resolve these serious issues. The Public Interest Disclosure Act 2013 (Cth) and the Public Governance Performance and Accountability Act 2013 (Cth) were enacted and received Royal assent following the 2013 CHOGM however those enactments have not been applied by lawfully to my Public Interest Disclosure Briefing Note dated 3rd September 2018 and 8 Annexures with 37 addendums and annexure by the relevant regulators being the



Commonwealth Attorney General (Managing Controller Appointed), The Department of Finance (Managing Controller Appointed) and the Commonwealth Ombudsman (Managing Controller Appointed). A copy of the Briefing Note with 8 annexures is annexed to the Notice without the subsequent 37 Addendums and Annexures.

These matters will be raised by me in DCCRM-19-73; *Regina v Garrett* & HMC-19-90956; *Regina v Garrett*; the use of Criminal proceedings by Regina (Managing Controller Appointed), Bankruptcy, Corporations Law, Vexatious Litigant Orders, Criminal Defamation is offensive to the Public Trust and the Doctrine of the Public Trust.

Thus far the various Legal Services Commissioners and the Attorney Generals have failed to provide proper funding to counsel to ensure ventilation of all of the matters arising in a proceeding to ensure complete justice is done in accordance with the findings of the High Court of Australia in *Re Wakim; Ex parte McNally* [1999] HCA 27 17 June 1999.

I also advise that I have lodged and served Form 504 Notices of Appointment of Managing Controller to the following entities as was annexed to my letter to the Reserve Bank of Australia dated 28th June 2019 for legal effect on the 23rd June 2019 (**Annexure 3**)

Over an extended period of time Regina (Managing Controller Appointed) has made numerous admissions of Facts, Liabilities and Indebtedness which value continues to escalate at the rates set out in Annexures 4 & 5 one of which debt has been paid to me, instead further actions are commenced with the sole and improper purpose of Harassment and Defamation.

The Commonwealth of Australia (Managing Controller Appointed) currently enjoys very favorable credit ratings (**Annexure 6**) which arise from the mismanagement of Human Rights and Rule of Law by avoiding deferring and frustrating payments of Compensation to victims deserving of Compensation causing those victims to then become victims of corrupt conduct of Regina (Managing Controller Appointed).

On the 30th April 2017 I settled the Australian People Future Fund and donated to that Fund 33% of the balance sheet value of OenoViva Capital Resources and associated rights so that fund could be applied to funding compensation in respect to Human Rights in a thought process to reduce the burden on Her Majesty's purse and avoid the application of the Bethcar Strategy by Regina (Managing Controller Appointed)

I look for to receiving your confirmation of receipt of service response to the service of the Notice and working through a fair and equitable solution.







Amongst the other sections highlighted in my letter to you dated 16th June 2019 and other earlier correspondence between 2016 and today's date I note that *The Reserve Bank of Australia Act 1959 (Cth)* sets out

77 Guarantee by Commonwealth

The Commonwealth is responsible for the payment of all moneys due by the Bank but nothing in this section authorizes a creditor or other person claiming against the Bank to sue the Commonwealth in respect of his or her claim.

The Commonwealth of Australia Act 1900 (UK) at Chapter II deals with the Executive Government. The key provision of that Chapter is s 61, which provides:

The executive power of the Commonwealth is vested in the Queen and is exercisable by the Governor-General as the Queen's representative, and extends to the execution and maintenance of this Constitution, and of the laws of the Commonwealth.

75 Original jurisdiction of High Court

In all matters:

(i) arising under any treaty;

(ii) affecting consuls or other representatives of other countries;

(iii) in which the Commonwealth, or a person suing or being sued on behalf of the Commonwealth, is a party;

- (iv) between States, or between residents of different States, or between a State and a resident of another State;
- (v) in which a writ of Mandamus or prohibition or an injunction is sought against an officer of the Commonwealth;
- the High Court shall have original jurisdiction.

80 Trial by jury

The trial on indictment of any offence against any law of the Commonwealth shall be by jury, and every such trial shall be held in the State where the offence was committed, and if the offence was not committed within any State the trial shall be held at such place or places as the Parliament prescribes.

The Judiciary Act 1903 (Cth) sets out as follows;

38 Matters in which jurisdiction of High Court exclusive

Subject to sections 39B and 44, the jurisdiction of the High Court shall be exclusive of the jurisdiction of the several Courts of the States in the following matters:

- (a) matters arising directly under any treaty;
- (b) suits between States, or between persons suing or being sued on behalf of different States, or between a State and a person suing or being sued on behalf of another State;
- (c) suits by the Commonwealth, or any person suing on behalf of the Commonwealth, against a State, or any person being sued on behalf of a State;
- (d) suits by a State, or any person suing on behalf of a State, against the Commonwealth or any person being sued on behalf of the Commonwealth;
- (e) matters in which a writ of mandamus or prohibition is sought against an officer of the Commonwealth or a federal court.

Note: Under the Jurisdiction of Courts (Cross-vesting) Act 1987, State Supreme Courts are, with some exceptions and limitations, invested with the same civil jurisdiction as the Federal Court has, including jurisdiction under section 39B of this Act.

55ZF Attorney-General may issue directions

- (1) The Attorney-General may issue directions (**Legal Services Directions**):
- (a) that are to apply generally to Commonwealth legal work; or
 - (b) that are to apply to Commonwealth legal work being performed, or to be performed, in relation to a particular matter.

55ZG Compliance with Legal Services Directions

- (2) Compliance with a Legal Services Direction is not enforceable except by, or upon the application of, the Attorney-General.



(3) The issue of non-compliance with a Legal Services Direction may not be raised in any proceeding (whether in a court, tribunal or other body) except by, or on behalf of, the Commonwealth.

56 Suits against the Commonwealth

- (1) A person making a claim against the Commonwealth, whether in contract or in tort, may in respect of the claim bring a suit against the Commonwealth:*
- (a) in the High Court;*

58 Suits against a State in matters of federal jurisdiction

Any person making any claim against a State, whether in contract or in tort, in respect of a matter in which the High Court has original jurisdiction or can have original jurisdiction conferred on it, may in respect of the claim bring a suit against the State in the Supreme Court of the State, or (if the High Court has original jurisdiction in the matter) in the High Court.

60 Injunction against a State and its officers

In a suit against a State brought in the High Court, the High Court may grant an injunction against the State and against all officers of the State and persons acting under the authority of the State, and may enforce the injunction against all such officers and persons.

61 Suits by Commonwealth

Suits on behalf of the Commonwealth may be brought in the name of the Commonwealth by the Attorney General or by any person appointed by him or her in that behalf.

64 Rights of parties

In any suit to which the Commonwealth or a State is a party, the rights of parties shall as nearly as possible be the same, and judgment may be given and costs awarded on either side, as in a suit between subject and subject

69 Indictments

(1) Indictable offences against the laws of the Commonwealth shall be prosecuted by indictment in the name of the Attorney General of the Commonwealth or of such other person as the Governor General appoints in that behalf.

(2) Any such appointment shall be by commission in the Queen's name, and may extend to the whole Commonwealth or to any State or part of the Commonwealth.

78B Notice to Attorneys General

(1) Where a cause pending in a federal court including the High Court or in a court of a State or Territory involves a matter arising under the Constitution or involving its interpretation, it is the duty of the court not to proceed in the cause unless and until the court is satisfied that notice of the cause, specifying the nature of the matter has been given to the Attorneys General of the Commonwealth and of the States, and a reasonable time has elapsed since the



giving of the notice for consideration by the Attorneys General, of the question of intervention in the proceedings or removal of the cause to the High Court.

80 Common law to govern

So far as the laws of the Commonwealth are not applicable or so far as their provisions are insufficient to carry them into effect, or to provide adequate remedies or punishment, the common law in Australia as modified by the Constitution and by the statute law in force in the State or Territory in which the Court in which the jurisdiction is exercised is held shall, so far as it is applicable and not inconsistent with the Constitution and the laws of the Commonwealth, govern all Courts exercising federal jurisdiction in the exercise of their jurisdiction in civil and criminal matters.

The Charter of the United Nations and Statute of the International Court of Justice (1945) UN sets out as follows

Article 6

A Member of the United Nations which has persistently violated the Principles contained in the present Charter may be expelled from the Organization by the General Assembly upon the recommendation of the Security Council.

CHAPTER IX

INTERNATIONAL ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL COOPERATION

Article 55

With a view to the creation of conditions of stability and well-being which are necessary for peaceful and friendly relations among nations based on respect for the principle of equal rights and self-determination of peoples, the United Nations shall promote:

a. higher standards of living, full employment, and conditions of economic and social progress and development;

b. solutions of international economic, social, health, and related problems; and inter-

national cultural and educational cooperation; and

c. universal respect for, and observance of, human rights and fundamental freedoms for all without distinction as to race, sex, language, or religion.



CHAPTER XIV

THE INTERNATIONAL COURT OF JUSTICE

Article 92

The International Court of Justice shall be the principal judicial organ of the United Nations. It shall function in accordance with the annexed Statute, which is based upon the Statute of the Permanent Court of International Justice and forms an integral part of the present Charter.

Article 93

1. All Members of the United Nations are *ipso facto* parties to the Statute of the International Court of Justice.

CHAPTER XVI

MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Article 102

1. Every treaty and every international agreement entered into by any Member of the United Nations after the present Charter comes into force shall as soon as possible be registered with the Secretariat and published by it.

Article 103

In the event of a conflict between the obligations of the Members of the United Nations under the present Charter and their obligations under any other international agreement, their obligations under the present Charter shall prevail.

Article 104

The Organization shall enjoy in the territory of each of its Members such legal capacity as may be necessary for the exercise of its functions and the fulfillment of its purposes.

THE STATUTE OF THE INTERNATIONAL COURT OF JUSTICE

Article 1

THE INTERNATIONAL COURT OF JUSTICE established by the Charter of the United Nations as the principal judicial organ of the United Nations shall be constituted and shall function in accordance with the provisions of the present Statute.



CHAPTER I ORGANIZATION OF THE COURT

Article 2

The Court shall be composed of a body of independent judges, elected regardless of their nationality from among persons of high moral character, who possess the qualifications required in their respective countries for appointment to the highest judicial offices, or are jurisconsults of recognized competence in international law.

Article 22

1. The seat of the Court shall be established at The Hague. This, however, shall not prevent the Court from sitting and exercising its functions elsewhere whenever the Court considers it desirable.
2. The President and the Registrar shall reside at the seat of the Court.

CHAPTER II COMPETENCE OF THE COURT

Article 34

1. Only states may be parties in cases before the Court.

Article 50

The Court may, at any time, entrust any individual, body, bureau, commission, or other organization that it may select, with the task of carrying out an enquiry or giving an expert opinion.

The Convention against Torture and Other Cruel, Inhuman or Degrading Treatment or Punishment (1985) UN sets out as follows;

Article 1

1. *For the purposes of this Convention, the term "torture" means any act by which severe pain or suffering, whether physical or mental, is intentionally inflicted on a person for such purposes as obtaining from him or a third person information or a confession, punishing him for an act he or a third person has committed or is suspected of having committed, or intimidating or coercing him or a third person, or for any reason based on discrimination of any kind, when such pain or suffering is inflicted by or at the instigation of or with the consent or acquiescence of a public official or other person*



acting in an official capacity, it does not include pain or suffering arising only from, inherent in or incidental to lawful sanctions.

The Charter of the Commonwealth of Nations (2013) Cth sets out as follows

CHARTER of the COMMONWEALTH

Signed by Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, Head of the Commonwealth,
Commonwealth Day 2013

I.

DEMOCRACY

We recognise the inalienable right of individuals to participate in democratic processes, in particular through free and fair elections in shaping the society in which they live. Governments, political parties and civil society are responsible for upholding and promoting democratic culture and practices and are accountable to the public in this regard. Parliaments and representative local governments and other forms of local governance are essential elements in the exercise of democratic governance.

We support the role of the Commonwealth Ministerial Action Group to address promptly and effectively all instances of serious or persistent violations of Commonwealth values without any fear or favour.

II.

HUMAN RIGHTS

We are committed to the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and other relevant human rights covenants and international instruments. We are committed to equality and respect for the protection and promotion of civil, political, economic, social and cultural rights, including the right to development, for all without discrimination on any grounds as the foundations of peaceful, just and stable societies. We note that these rights are universal, indivisible, interdependent and interrelated and cannot be implemented selectively.

We are implacably opposed to all forms of discrimination, whether rooted in gender, race, colour, creed, political belief or other grounds.

V.

FREEDOM OF EXPRESSION

We are committed to peaceful, open dialogue and the free flow of information, including through a free and responsible media, and to enhancing democratic traditions and strengthening democratic processes.

VI.

SEPARATION OF POWERS

We recognise the importance of maintaining the integrity of the roles of the Legislature, Executive and Judiciary. These are the guarantors in their respective spheres of the rule of law, the promotion and protection of fundamental human rights and adherence to good governance.

VII.

RULE OF LAW

We believe in the rule of law as an essential protection for the people of the Commonwealth and as an assurance of limited and accountable government. In particular we support an independent, impartial, honest and competent judiciary and recognise that an independent, effective and competent legal system is integral to upholding the rule of law, engendering public confidence and dispensing justice.

VIII.

GOOD GOVERNANCE

We reiterate our commitment to promote good governance through the rule of law, to ensure transparency and accountability and to root out, both at national and international levels, systemic and systematic corruption.



The International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights 1966 (UN) sets out as follows;

2. *All peoples may, for their own ends, freely dispose of their natural wealth and resources without prejudice to any obligations arising out of international economic co-operation, based upon the principle of mutual benefit, and international law. In no case may a people be deprived of its own means of subsistence.*
3. *The States Parties to the present Covenant, including those having responsibility for the administration of Non-Self-Governing and Trust Territories, shall promote the realization of the right of self-determination, and shall respect that right, in conformity with the provisions of the Charter of the United Nations.*

Also please note my Submissions in VID 129 of 2015; *Garrett v Commissioner of Taxation* and VID 297 of 2015; *Garrett v Cahill* heard together and the decision of the Australian Human Rights Commissioner acting under your instructions (**annexure 1**)

The late Professor Geoffrey Sawer wrote it was certain from the beginning that the Australian courts would have the power of judicial review, including the power to hold Acts of Parliament void for unconstitutionality. He said:

“The Australian Constitution does not in specific terms confer this power on the courts, but it has many provisions which are unintelligible unless such a power



was intended; for example, the reference to courts and judges as bound by the Constitution (covering Clause 5), the provision for cases involving inter se questions (s 74) and the provision for High Court jurisdiction in matters arising under the Constitution or involving its interpretation (s 76).¹

As you know, the nature of the relationship between Bank and Customer is that of Debtor and Creditor in which regard Notice to Agent is Notice to Principal and Vice Versa; at all-relevant times you have been the controlling mind of the Central Bank of the Commonwealth Bank of Australia and are in control of the Payment Systems operated by Banking Licensees of Regina and are consequently liable for the performance of all Contracts of a Banking Nature between the Bank and Customer; your liability is personal to me as the customer/the creditor

You are an employee of and Agency created by Regina and act in the implementation of Monetary Policy and the Law as it applies to Banking. Amongst the applicable law that governs your actions is *the Common Law, the Commonwealth of Australia Constitution Act 1900 (Cth) ("the Constitution")*, *the Bills of Exchange Act 1908 (Cth)*, *the Reserve Bank of Australia Act 1959 (Cth)* (establishing the Payments Systems Board), *the Banking Act 1959 (Cth)*, *the Banking Regulations 1966 (Cth)*, *the Payment Systems Regulations Act 1998 (Cth)*, *the UNCITRAL Convention of International Bills of Exchange and Promissory Notes 1988 (UN)*, Australian treaty series 5, 23, 39 and *the Charters of the United Nations and the Commonwealth of Nations*.

As a consequence of the conduct found against the Banking System in respect to the Monetisation of Value and theft of Stored Value and other assets from Bank Customers by you in the recent reports from APRA and the recent Royal Commission into the Finance Sector as a result of systemic Fraud on the Peoples of Australia over an extended period of time, Regina felt compelled to restate and re-execute the Charter of the Commonwealth of Nations on Commonwealth Day 2013 leading to the enactment of *the Performance Governance and Accountability Act 2013 (Cth)* in which regard the Banking Code of Conduct is a Code of Conduct published under that Act and the Common Law.

In your dealings with us you have continued to violate that Code in which regard your conduct is a Disclosable Conduct in the Public Interest under *the Public Interest Disclosure Act 2013 (Cth)*

You are an employee of a Licensee/Agent of Regina you are a Public Official and are bound as Holder of Public Office and your Public Duty to disclose to the Commonwealth Ombudsman, and/ or otherwise to the relevant First Officers of Law, Public Interest Disclosable Conduct under the aforementioned Legislation.

It is your Public Duty in the Public Trust to exercise Quasi-Judicial Discretion which discretion may only be exercised in the Public Interest as distinct from your duty to your employer.

Banking processes are driven by reputation, undisputed facts and the aforementioned banking law, since 2015 Regina has admitted a number of facts, Liabilities and Indebtedness which is the subject of a Notice

of Seizure of Collateral/ Crystallisation of Charges/Appointment of Managing Controller dated 1st June 2019 (“**the Notice**”) served upon you and that is set out on our websites <https://www.oenoviva-capital-resources.com/> at <https://www.oenoviva-capital-resources.com/seizure-notice/>

Amongst other things you admit holding UNCITRAL International Bills of Exchange which are held by you for value received; You have not credited our accounts or the accounts of any other person named on those instruments as payee in breach of the contract between Bank and Customer in which regard you owe us either.....the Instruments or the amount of the vale expressed on the face of those instruments.....plus cost loss and damage.

As you are all too aware the face value of those instruments are underwritten by your own undertaking as to cost loss and damage dated 4th August 2004 given in SASC 127 of 2004; *Garrett v NAB* binding Regina and otherwise.

We are account holders and customer of yours in which regard you are the Debtor and I am the Creditor.....in all of my capacities including as the secured party.

You are in continued breach of your obligations to comply with the Banking Code of Conduct and the Contracts between us being further events of Default under the Provisions of *the Personal Property Security Act 2009* (Cth) (**the PPSA**), and the aforementioned applicable law being further evidence of collapse of Rule of Law under the relevant treaties.

The starting point in the analysis of and Your relevant personal obligations is s3 of the PPSA being an overview of the purposes of the act,

s10 of the PPSA defines security interest by reference to cl 12(1) ;

“A security Interest means an interest in personal property provided for a transaction that, in substance, secures the payment of an obligation (without regard to the form of the transaction or the identity of the person who has title to the property)”

s19(1)(2) of the PPSA are also relevant;

- (1) A security interest is enforceable against a grantor in respect of particular collateral only if the security interest has attached to the collateral
- (2) A security interest attaches to collateral when
 - (a) the grantor has rights in the collateral, or the power to transfer rights in the collateral to the secured party; and
 - (b) either;
 - (i) value is given for the security interest; or
 - (ii) the grantor does an act by which the security interest arises.



s19(1) Value passed on various dates in respect to your Banking Licensees which became the date of our acceptance of your various letters of offer of finance when consideration passes and the Purchased Payment Facilities were established;

The security interest defined under s12(1) has become enforceable against you as the Grantor in accordance with s19(1)

Consent to create a security interest need not be written and may be found in a written document, oral agreement or a combination of both see *Haliburton Broadcasting Group Inc v Van Duyn* (2008) 14 PPSAC (3d) 77 (Ontario Supreme Court of Justice) setting authority under the Common Law.

On the 30th April 2017 33% of the assets and undertakings of OenoViva Capital Resources (“OVCR”) was gifted/donated to the Trustees of the Australian People Future Fund (“APFF”) along with all relevant rights associated with enforcement of that Gift in which regard I wrote to you as set out in the correspondence.

On the 17th December 2018 the Trustees of APFF and OVCR resolved to domicile the Trusts in the Tax Jurisdiction of Hong Kong with effect from the 1st December 2018.

SA winemaker ran a 'royal commission' into his own life



In one case, former South Australian winemaker Andrew Garrett wrote a 433-page document detailing "scandalous" allegations against the National Australia Bank (NAB), his own lawyers and liquidators.

He also claimed Supreme Court judges had spent 10 months trying to "gag" him.

When Justice Tim Anderson declared Mr Garrett a vexatious litigant in the SA Supreme Court in 2007, he described the 433-page document as "puzzling" and stated the bankrupt man had wanted to "run a royal commission" into his own life.

"Mr Garrett is an intelligent man who has chosen to be stubborn and belligerent in taking on NAB but also many other professional people," he said in his decision.

Court documents stated Mr Garrett owed NAB more than \$15 million as of January 2006.

Mr Garrett launched more than 30 lawsuits between 2004 and 2007.

Another SA serial litigant, Kazimir Kowalski, started his legal crusade against Mitsubishi Motors more than 30 years ago.

He settled with Mitsubishi Motors in 1998 and received \$200,000 in compensation after numerous injury claims from 1986.

Despite the settlement, the SA Attorney-General claimed 109 lawsuits initiated by Mr Kowalski — in seven different courts and tribunals — were vexatious, and Mr Kowalski was declared a vexatious litigant in 2014.

SA Attorney-General Vickie Chapman said vexatious litigants "not only clog up the system" but they also cost both the taxpayer and private individuals who may be subject to numerous, baseless claims.

"Access to justice in a timely manner is an important part of our civil justice system, which is why it is so important we have laws that help the courts deal with vexatious litigants in an appropriate manner," she said.

It appears to me that despite the evidence on the court files that are a matter for the Public Record and as set out in the Notice that only a maximum of \$6,300,000 was acknowledged by NAB as being owed that your reference that \$15 Million was owed to your licensee NAB is false misleading and deceptive and intended to mislead the reader into believing that I borrowed \$15 Million from NAB which is denied and further is a lie designed to mislead the Reader and that no money was ever collected by NAB in respect to securities held by your licensee which is also a lie designed to mislead.

We are committed to peaceful, open dialogue and the free flow of information, including through a free and responsible media, and to enhancing democratic traditions and strengthening democratic processes.

As you are aware I have recently pointed out to the Adelaide Advertiser and News Limited in my correspondence that has been copied to you the rights of the peoples to responsible media as set out in article V of the Charter of the Commonwealth of Nations which underwrites independence of journalism to investigate all of the facts, including the defamation issues arising from judgements of Courts and Tribunals over an extended period.
